## What is a Bicycle Friendly Community?

A Bicycle Friendly Community welcomes cyclists by providing well-engineered bicycle facilities, creating new places to ride, educating motorists and cyclists on the rules of the road, and encouraging people to bike for transportation and recreation.



### Why should my community apply?

Bicycle Friendly Communities have a high quality of life that translates into sustainable development, tourism, business growth and even increased property values. Encouraging bicycling is an effective way to increase physical activity, improve air quality, reduce traffic congestion and foreign oil dependence, and tackle climate change and obesity. Benefits for the more than 200 communities that have applied for BFC status include:

- Inspiration to do more
- Technical assistance and training
- Grants and funding notification
- Recognition and promotion

### What are the requirements?

The Bicycle Friendly Community application is an audit of a community's efforts to create a bicycling culture. The audit reviews engineering, education, encouragement, enforcement, and evaluation and planning efforts for bicycling.

### Who reviews applications?

Each application is reviewed by national experts and local cyclists to determine whether the community should get a BFC designation. Feedback from the reviewers creates a valuable roadmap for action.

### How will my community be recognized?

The League will recognize deserving communities at one of four award levels: bronze, silver, gold, or platinum. The League will issue a press release, and will present an award and two highway-quality road signs at a local ceremony or celebration.

### What if my community doesn't deserve the award?

Get involved with your local bike club or advocacy organization, join your community's bicycle advisory committee and work with your city staff. Use the BFC application as a task list to improve the state of cycling in your community.
