A RESOLUTION AWARDING A SLUDGE CONDITIONING POLYMER SUPPLY CONTRACT FOR THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY

WHEREAS, the Wastewater Treatment Facility uses sludge conditioning polymer to assist in the dewatering of sewage sludge; and

WHEREAS, a bid opening was scheduled on November 14, 2016, to supply sludge conditioning polymer for 2017 with two one-year mutually agreed upon extensions; and

WHEREAS, this request for bids was publicly advertised and sent directly to the current supplier and five additional potential bidders, with two additional potential bidders found to no longer be business; and

WHEREAS, past request for bids for this material have also yielded only one bidder; and

WHEREAS, Polydyne, Inc. submitted the only bid of \$1.10 per pound for this polymer; and

WHEREAS, funds for this purchase were included in the requested 2017 Wastewater Treatment Facility operations budget; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager and the Director of Public Works recommends a contract award to Polydyne, Inc;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute a contract with Polydyne, Inc., 1 Chemical Plant Road, Riceboro, Georgia, 31323, to supply sludge conditioning polymer to the City of Canandaigua for the period January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017, at a unit price of \$1.10 per pound based on estimated quantities not to exceed budgeted appropriations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said budget, as adopted by the City Council of the City of Canandaigua, shall be effective for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2017.

Discussion: Councilmember-at-Large Terwilliger explained budget impact in all funds. Council tried to offer fiscally prudent budget with a 4.21% increase in the tax levy and a corresponding 1.31% increase in the tax rate. The General Fund will also use \$490,870 of appropriated fund balance to close the budget gap. The water rate increase 5% while the sewer rate remains the same. This budget maintains outstanding City services without overburdening taxpayers.

All Councilmembers commented on the budget and budget process. Thanked City staff for the great job they do on the budget and City Council members for civility in budget discussions. This budget was done with compromise and negotiation. They realize that there is very little control over many item in the budget as well as many unfunded mandates. The City budget also contains long term plans like Capital which makes things easier. Several Councilmembers mentioned items that need that they would like to discuss over the next year.

WHEREAS, the Downtown Business Improvement District (BID) was established by the City Council on July 9, 1992 by Local Law No. 4; and

WHEREAS, the operation of the BID is governed by the provisions set forth in Article 19-A of the General Municipal Law, Section 980j of which requires that the expense incurred in the operation of the district shall be financed in accordance with the district plan upon which the establishment of the district was based, and that the district charge upon benefited real property shall be imposed as provided in the district plan; and that the charge shall be determined, levied, and collected in the same manner and at the same time and by the same officers as the general municipal taxes are levied and collected; and

WHEREAS, the proposed 2017 BID budget will be accepted by the Board of Directors of the Downtown Canandaigua Business Management Association, Inc. at its meeting of December 21, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the BID’s 2017 budget, a summary of which is attached hereto, includes an amount not to exceed \$34,494 in anticipated revenue to be generated by the BID charge;
